“Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” Game Rules

The following are the game specific rules for the Iowa Lottery raffle game called “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle”. These rules are in compliance with the Computerized Lottery Games General Rules in 531 Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 20

Authorization of Computerized Lottery Games

The lottery authority board authorizes the sale of computerized games to be played in compliance with the criteria set forth in Chapter 20.

1. Computerized Lottery Definitions

- A. “CEO” means the Chief Executive Officer of the Iowa Lottery Authority or any other person to whom the CEO’s authority is lawfully delegated.
- B. “Central Computer” or “Central Computer System” is a computer system designated to control, monitor, and communicate with the terminals and to record the transactions processed by the terminals.
- C. “Drawing” means that process that is used to randomly select winning unique eight-digit numbers for the game.
- D. “Drawing machine” means a computer or other device that determines the outcome of the process of selection of winning tickets in a Lottery.
- E. “Game” shall mean the computerized “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” pool exhaustion game conducted by the Lottery.
- F. “Game ticket” or “ticket” means a ticket produced by a terminal that is the tangible evidence to prove participation. Each ticket will contain a unique, eight-digit number issued sequentially across Iowa, starting with 10000001 and ending with 10120000.
- G. “Lottery” means the Iowa Lottery.
- H. “Play” means the purchase of a ticket with a sequentially-generated, unique, eight-digit number between and including 10000001 and 10120000 that constitutes a valid entry in a pool exhaustion game.
- I. “Pool exhaustion game” means a game where a predetermined pool of plays is established.
- J. “Retailer” means a person or entity authorized by the Iowa Lottery to sell game plays.
- K. “Terminal” means a device that is authorized by the Lottery to function with a central computer system for the purpose of issuing, entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions.
- L. “Winning numbers” means the selection of unique, eight-digit numbers randomly selected at the drawing, which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on game tickets.

2. Game Description

- A. “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” is a pool exhaustion game that pays set prizes depending on the order in which the unique eight-digit numbers are selected.
- B. To play “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle”, a player must purchase a ticket in the “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” game from the retailer. The retailer will then issue a ticket, via the terminal, containing the next available unique, eight-digit number between and including 10000001 and 10120000, which constitutes a game play. Each ticket sold for “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” game will be generated separately. Each ticket will bear a unique eight-digit number on the face of the ticket.

C. The sale of tickets in the “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” game will begin on April 13, 2008, and end when 120,000 tickets containing unique, eight-digit numbers between and including 10000001 and 10120000 have been issued or at 11:59 p.m. on June 14, 2008, whichever occurs first.

3. Claims

A ticket shall be the only proof of a game play and the submission of a winning ticket to the Lottery or retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes.

4. Player Responsibility

The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the retailer who is acting on behalf of the player in entering the play. The purchaser of the “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the condition of the data printed on the ticket. The Lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen tickets.

5. Price of Ticket

The price of each “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket shall be \$20.00. Each ticket shall contain a single play. No person shall sell an “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket at a price other than that fixed by this part.

6. Ticket Characteristics and Restrictions

A. The player shall request an “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket which will be printed by the lottery terminal and will contain a unique, eight-digit number. The play amount is \$20.00. The retailer will then issue a ticket that shall contain the unique, eight-digit number, amount bet and system control number data.

B. Players shall only be entitled to the next available eight-digit game number when purchasing a ticket. A player shall not select specific eight-digit numbers. Numbers shall be generated in sequential numerical order based on instruction from the central computer system with the next consecutive number.

C. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

D. A ticket may not be canceled.

E. No person other than a licensed Lottery retailer shall sell a ticket.

7. Time, Place and Manner of Conducting a Drawing

A computer-generated random number selection procedure will be used to draw the winning raffle numbers as designated by the drawing procedures. An eight-digit ticket number will not be eligible to win more than once during the drawing. Each winning raffle ticket will be awarded only one prize.

A sufficient number of random numbers will be drawn to ensure there are 112 valid numbers. The first valid number generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will win the \$1,000,000 cash prize, the second valid number generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will win the \$100,000 cash prize, the third through twelfth valid numbers generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will each win a \$5,000 cash prize and the thirteenth through one hundred twelfth valid numbers generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will each win a \$500 cash prize.

The drawing will be held in accordance with the schedule posted to the Lottery's Web site (www.ialottery.com) under the heading "Public Drawings." The drawing will be held on the specified date under the supervision of a lottery drawing officer, or a designee, an independent auditor and a lottery security officer. All drawings are videotaped. All drawings of the Iowa Lottery Authority are public events.

Persons who attend drawings must show a valid photo ID and be supervised by a member of the Iowa Lottery Security Division during the drawing. A request to attend a drawing must be received by the lottery no later than 24 hours in advance of the drawing.

A. The raffle drawing will be held approximately 3 work days following the date all 120,000 tickets have been sold or on a final scheduled drawing date of June 17, 2008, whichever occurs first.

B. The "Iowa's Million Dollar Raffle" drawing will be conducted by the Iowa Lottery at Lottery headquarters.

C. During the drawing, the Lottery will draw, at random, a sufficient number of unique eight-digit numbers between 10000001 and including the last number sold to the public that will be known as the winning numbers after verification.

D. If any number is drawn more than once, the first occurrence shall be considered valid and subsequent occurrences shall be considered invalid.

8. Prize Pool

The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of \$1,200,000.00.

9. Odds of Winning

The following table sets forth the odds of winning and the distribution of winners in and among each prize category based upon 120,000 tickets being sold. The actual odds will be based on the actual number of tickets sold.

Prize Amount	Number of Winners	Odds of Winning
\$1,000,000	1	1 in 120,000
\$100,000	1	1 in 120,000
\$5,000	10	1 in 12,000
\$500	100	1 in 1,200

Overall odds: 1 in 1071

10. Entry

Players purchasing an "Iowa's Million Dollar Raffle" ticket will be eligible for the drawing. Players must retain their raffle tickets until the drawing date to see if they are winners and present their tickets to claim their prizes.

11. Eligibility

Players must purchase “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” tickets on or after April 13, 2008 and before 11:59 p.m., June 14, 2008. Ticket sales will end when all 120,000 raffle tickets have been sold or on Saturday, June 14, 2008 whichever comes first. Players will receive raffle tickets, which they must KEEP in order to claim their prizes. No person under the age of 21 shall be eligible to purchase a ticket. No prize shall be paid to any person ineligible for payment under the provisions of Iowa Code 99G.31(g) or (h). Players may purchase more than one raffle ticket and may win more than once, but only once per raffle ticket.

12. Determination of Prize Winners

An “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket shall be a winning ticket if the unique eight-digit number on the ticket matches exactly a number selected by the Lottery in the drawing.

A. The first valid number generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, in the drawing will win the \$1,000,000 cash prize,

B. The second valid number generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will win the \$100,000 cash prize,

C. The third through twelfth valid numbers generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will each win a \$5,000 cash prize,

D. The thirteenth through one hundred twelfth valid numbers generated, as designated by the drawing procedures, will each win a \$500 cash prize.

13. Redemption

Winning \$500 raffle tickets may be cashed at any Iowa Lottery retailer if cash is available or at any of the Lottery’s Regional Offices. Winning \$5,000 and \$100,000 raffle tickets can be cashed at any of the Lottery’s Regional Offices located in Cedar Rapids, Council Bluffs, Des Moines, Mason City and Storm Lake. The winning \$1,000,000 raffle ticket must be claimed at the Iowa Lottery Authority, 2323 Grand Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa 50312. Winning number information will be available: through regional posters delivered to retailers, via online lottery game retailer terminals under winning numbers reports, in newspapers across the state and on our web site at www.ialottery.com. If there is any alteration, mutilation, tear, or other ambiguity on the ticket, the retailer is not authorized to make direct payment and the ticket must be submitted to the Lottery.

If the claim is validated by the Lottery, the check in the appropriate amount will be forwarded to the player less any applicable Federal and State withholding tax and debt owed under Iowa Statutes. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Lottery, the claim shall be denied and the player shall be notified promptly.

14. Claiming Prizes

Prizes must be claimed within 90 calendar days of the drawing. For purposes of determining the claim period, the drawing date shall not be counted. If a prize is claimed by mail, the Lottery must actually receive the ticket and claim form within the claim period. Any prize not properly claimed within the specified period shall be forfeited. No winning ticket holder will be awarded a higher prize in the event a ticket fails to properly validate or if there is a prize forfeiture.

15. Ticket Validation Requirements

A. All claims for prizes are subject to validation by the lottery.

To be a valid “Iowa’s Million Dollar Raffle” ticket, all of the following requirements must be satisfied:

1. The ticket must have been issued by the Lottery through a retailer, via a terminal, in an authorized manner.
2. The information on the ticket must correspond precisely with the Lottery’s computer record.
3. The ticket serial number must appear in its entirety, and correspond, using a computer validation file, to the winning game play printed on the ticket.
4. A ticket shall be void unless the ticket is printed on a paper stock roll that was validly issued to and used, at the time of the play, by the retailer from whom the ticket was purchased.
5. The ticket must not be produced in error, counterfeit in whole or in part, altered, mutilated, unreadable, tampered with in any manner, incomplete, blank or partially blank, miscut, or defective.
6. The ticket must pass all other security criteria determined by the Lottery.
7. The ticket must not be stolen.
8. The ticket must not be canceled.
9. The ticket must pass additional validation requirements stated in these rules and other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

B. In the event that a ticket fails to pass all of the validation criteria set forth in these game rules, it is invalid and ineligible for any prize. The Lottery, in its sole discretion, may choose to pay a sum equal to the prize on an invalid ticket if the Lottery can determine the prize that would have been won by the ticket by use of a code number or other mechanism. The Lottery’s decisions as to whether a ticket is invalid and whether a sum equal to the prize on an invalid ticket will be paid are final. If the Lottery determines that a ticket is not eligible to receive a prize or a sum equivalent to the prize amount, the Lottery may refund the purchase price of the ticket. A refund of the purchase price shall be the claimant’s sole and exclusive remedy. The determination of the Iowa Lottery Authority CEO is final and binding.

16. Allowance for Delay of Payment

The Lottery may delay payment of the prize pending a final determination by the CEO under any of the following circumstances:

- A. If a dispute occurs or it appears likely that a dispute may occur regarding the prize;
- B. If there is any question regarding the identity or statutory eligibility of the claimant;
- C. If there is any question regarding the validity of the ticket presented for payment; or
- D. If the claim is subject to any offset for delinquent debts owed by the claimant under Iowa Statutes.

No interest for any delay shall accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

17. Ticket Ownership

- A. A ticket is owned by its physical possessor until such time as a signature is placed upon the back of a ticket in the area designated for signature. When a signature is placed on the back of the ticket in the designated space, the person whose signature appears in the designated space is the owner of the ticket and is entitled to any prize attributable to the ticket.
- B. Notwithstanding any name or names submitted on a claim form, the Lottery shall make payment to the person whose signature appears on the back of the ticket in the designated space.
- C. If the signatures of more than one person appear in that space, the Lottery shall make payment to the person identified on the winner’s claim form to receive payment, the designation of whom shall be made by all persons whose signatures appear on the reverse side of the ticket. In the

event that all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the Lottery may withhold payment until the proper payee is determined.

18. Governing Law

In purchasing a ticket, the player agrees to comply with and abide by this game's rules for the "Iowa's Million Dollar Raffle" game.
